Role Description

We're currently seeking new facilitators to deliver PlaySafe Workshops across British Columbia through an in-person and virtual delivery methods.

Facilitators will lead these 1-hour-long workshops on a request basis for organizations that deliver sport and recreation programs, such as schools, sport organizations, clubs, and associations. Workshops will be delivered to athletes, parents, coaches, staff, and board members, and will be customized for each audience.

We are looking for people that are passionate about safe participation in sport and recreation and have experience creating inclusive and engaging environments where participants feel comfortable sharing their ideas.

Facilitators should have flexible schedules as requests for delivery may vary (weekday, evening, weekends). You will be contacted to deliver workshops on an as-needed basis. Workshops may be delivered virtually or in-person at the host facility (i.e. classroom, multi-purpose room).

Qualifications & Skills

- Strong communication skills and experience speaking to groups of all ages
- Demonstrated experience as a facilitator in online and in-person environments.
- Available for 6-10 workshop deliveries per year with the possibility for growth.
- Ability to adapt content or delivery methods, as required.
- Empathy, active listening and comfort handling difficult conversations and safe sport disclosures.
- Comfortable with technology (Zoom, Menti.com, others).
- Post-Secondary education in a related field (sports intervention, physical and health education, sport psychology etc.) or equivalent experience preferred
- Knowledge of BC Sport Sector recommended
- Completion of Commit to Kids child protection training (recommended)

What to Expect

- Successful candidates will be required to:
 - Attend a mandatory two-day facilitator training on September 19th and 20th, 2025, in Greater Vancouver (in-person; travel, accommodation, and meals covered).
 - Complete Commit to Kids virtual training on child protection prior to delivering workshops.
- Connection to a community of practice with other facilitators in B.C.

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- Workshops may be delivered virtually or in-person at the host facility (ie. classroom, multi-purpose room).
- You will receive support from viaSport's Safe Sport Manager to customize content for each delivery.
- Access to Zoom platform and other required software will be provided by viaSport.
- Presentations will be delivered using your personal computer.

Compensation:

Payment for preparation and delivery is \$325 per workshop. If requested to travel, expenses will be covered by the host organization.
